

The parable of the ten virgins (Matthew 25:1-13) encourages those living in the Tribulation to be prepared and ready for the Second Advent of Jesus. In what ways could a believer living today, in the Church Age, be prepared and ready for the Rapture when Jesus comes to gather up the Church?

The parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-30) encourages faithfulness and responsibility in those living during the Tribulation. What has God entrusted to each of us, that He wants invested for His glory?

In the parable of the Talents the master is not equitable in discharging talents and the outcomes are therefore are not the same accordingly. Does this idea correspond to the Apostle Paul's image of the church as a body with many parts (1Corinthians 12:12-31)? Why or why not?

Ask yourself if Jesus came today to gather the church, would you be ready to meet Him? Why or why not?
